



Call for assistance! **Ateneo – S L B** **Negros Relief Mission**



On February 6, 2012, a 6.9 magnitude earthquake tore down the Negros Oriental's tranquility to rubbles. Days after the big quake, the people try to live by the aftershocks they now experience routinely, along with fears of a tsunami surge. Many families have temporarily abandoned their houses for fear of the strong earthquake happening again. With water structures being affected and stores

shutting down, there is now a widespread scarceness on the daily basic needs such as food and water.

The Ateneo de Manila University DReaM Team (Disaster Response and Management Team) and Simbahang Lingkod ng Bayan (SLB) are responding to calls for assistance from various communities affected by natural calamities. Today, it is making a plea for financial donations on behalf of the La Libertad, which was badly affected by the Negros Oriental earthquake.

As of this posting, there are approximately 900 families that are still in need of relief effort. The families come from **Brgys. Pisong, South Poblacion, Congabo, Manulaga, Manalapatan, Magbuaya, and Maragondong in La Libertad**. Visit : www.e-ugnay.slb.ph for details on these areas. Due to limited land accessibility, we seek your usual generosity through monetary support. Your donations will be used to purchase water and ready-to-eat food items from Bacolod City.
